

## HIV/AIDS 500 TRAINING ON-LINE

- The Bureau of Communicable Diseases, HIV/AIDS Section release the **HIV/AIDS 500 training on-line** in the Florida Department of Health Official Learning Management System -TRAIN Florida-.
  - The HIV/AIDS 500 is the prerequisite to the HIV/AIDS 501 classroom training that is required prior to offering publicly funded HIV testing services in Florida.
  - The on-line training meets the requirements of *Technical Assistance Guideline 345-17-13, Minimum Standards for HIV Counselors, Trainers and Early Intervention Consultants*.
  - The training is available to Department staff as well as community partners and serves as an alternative to the classroom training.
  - The course can be found by searching for **FDOH HIV/AIDS 500 The Basics of HIV/AIDS Counseling, Testing and Linkage** within the TRAIN course list.
  - **Non-DOH** staff **must create their own account** before attempting to access the course through <https://www.train.org/DesktopShell.aspx>.
  - **Department of Health employees** can access TRAIN through: <https://fl.train.org/DesktopShell.aspx> (**without creating a new account**)
  - The course is a blended learning series of 7 sections including a learner's guide and an Introduction.
  - Sections 1 through 5 are followed by a **short quiz**. Participants must complete each quiz in order, and with a **minimum score of 80%** before completing the course.
  - Each section is also followed by an evaluation, which we ask participants to complete. Upon completion of the entire blended learning series, participants are issued a certificate for the course. The participant will then need to complete the FDOH HIV/AIDS 501 Online course, **which serves as admission to the next available 500/501 classroom training**.
